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


Fig 1: Proposed System Architecture

A. ALGORITHM

1. Levenshtein Distance Algorithm

We are using this algorithm to match query entered by the user with available data in database. It calculates the distance between user query and available data in system and then it clusters the data and recommends it to user.

Input: city name

Output: Recommended friends according to the city entered.

Steps:

1: Set n to be the length of s.

Set m to be the length of t.

If n = 0, return m and exit.

If m = 0, return n and exit.

Construct a matrix containing 0...m rows and 0...n columns.

- 2: Initialize the first row to 0..n. Initialize the first column to 0..m.
- 3: Examine each character of s (i from 1 to n).
- 4: Examine each character of t (j from 1 to m).
- 5: If s[i] equals t[j], the cost is 0.

If s[i] doesn't equal t[j], the cost is 1.

- 6: Set cell d[i,j] of the matrix equal to the minimum of:
- a. The cell immediately above plus 1: d[i-1,j] + 1.
- b. The cell immediately to the left plus 1: d[i,j-1] + 1.
- c. The cell diagonally above and to the left plus the cost: d[i-1,j-1] + cost.
- 7: After the iteration steps (3, 4, 5, 6) are complete, the distance is found in cell d[n,m].

In the result below we have shown the number of migrated students in that city. So we can check how many students are getting education in that particular city.




Figure 2: Graph for Migrated Student
